A farmer named Muldoon lived alone in the Irish countryside except for a pet dog he doted on. The dog finally died, and Muldoon went to the parish priest, saying, 'Father, the dog is dead. Could you possibly be saying a mass for the poor creature?' Father Kelly refused point blank, 'No, we can't have services for an animal in the church, but I'll tell you what, there's a new denomination down the road, and there is no telling what they believe in, maybe they'll do something for the animal.' Muldoon said, 'I'll go right now. By the way, do you think 10,000 pounds is enough to donate for the service?' to which Father replied, 'Now why didn't you tell me the dog was a Catholic!'





A cheap jibe regularly levelled at the Church is that while we preach about justice and development for all people, we are one of the world's wealthiest multinationals. Sometimes Catholics are stung by this criticism. There is something healthy about that because there is always more we can, and should, do about our detachment from materialism. At the same time, however, our accusers should be reminded of a few facts that spoil their good story.

In commercial terms the Church is asset rich and cash poor. Many established churches through good planning and generosity have a large plant on decent real estate, but I don't know a diocese, religious order, parish or Church agency that does not need to carefully look at its cash flow. We rely on your goodness to keep going each year. Our real estate is often our only collateral for our borrowing; always done to improve the services we can render the People of God. The greatest thing going for the Catholic Church, however, is you, Christ's faithful people who witness day in and day out to the power of Jesus' life, death and resurrection. We are also asset rich in terms of the quality of the women and men – lay, professed and ordained – who selflessly serve the Church and the world. (Cont'd P3)

When we are attacked for the land and buildings we have it's always good to remember some facts about our Catholic family's commitment to the poor: outside the United Nations and governments, Catholicism is the largest provider of education, health, welfare, personal assistance and Third World development in the world; we have the largest and lowest-paid charitable workforce of any international group; we have been trying to serve God, not money, for two thousand years; and from the earliest Christians to this very day, some Catholics have loved and served the poor so faithfully, that they die with them, and for them.

Where all of this is concerned, we are our own worst enemies. False humility has meant we have not sufficiently celebrated what Grace has done in and through us in regards to poverty and the world's poor. None of this excuses us from the direct challenges in today's Gospel. We all know how seductive money is and how quickly greed can throw our moral and spiritual compasses off course. In moral theology, however, intention is critical and even money, seductive as it is, can be, and is, put to good service in Christ's kingdom. It's always a question of where the heart is.

By not publicly acknowledging the service done in our name and with our assistance, we do the Church and ourselves an injustice. When we fail to explain the number of times and places Christians clearly put Jesus ahead of money we allow the Church's critics to have the last word, as though it was the only word on the subject.

May this Eucharist, this meal of Christ's poor, assist us to be detached from anything that masters our deepest desires away from Christ and keeps us from serving his kingdom of justice, development and peace for all people everywhere.

Restoration of Pews Appeal:

I am delighted to announce that <u>ALL</u> 63 pews have been sponsored! I thank all those who have been generous in their support of this Restoration Appeal. I recently met with Tony Fallshaw, the gentleman whose company will be refurbishing the pews, who said the pews will come back to the original light colour of the timber. Interestingly, Tony's father was the one who constructed our pews. A family tradition continues.



Allocation of the pews will be by ballot. The Fundraising Committee believe this to be the fairest way to allocate the pews.

Refurbishment of Altar Furniture:

In light of the obvious support for the Restoration of Pews, the Fundraising Committee for the Restoration Appeal were of the view that people may wish to support the refurbishment of the Altar furniture. There will be an opportunity of having a plaque in remembrance of their loved ones and a token of their generosity on the refurbished furniture. The costing and the process of this new element of the appeal is still to be worked out (we are still awaiting the quote from Tony Fallshaw who will be undertaking the furniture upgrade).

The refurbishment of the furniture will ensure there is a consistent, dignified and sacredness to each piece of furniture. Also, there will be an honouring of the essential wooden style of the furniture. The new pieces of furniture will include a new lectern, two matching "sofa tables" (the Credence and Offertory tables), two to four benches for the Devotional Chapel, a secondary chair for Concelebration, and an upgraded wooden support for the Tabernacle. Also there would be a cleaning and polishing of the Stations of the Cross as well as the wood carvings of the Holy Family and Our Lady.

There will be a cleaning and upgrade of the Altar, Baptismal Font, secondary Lectern, Paschal Candle and President's Chair. The Christ figure on the Cross will be cleaned and polished, and a new (yet to be designed) Cross to replace the present one.

Special Collection for the Refurbishment:

There are still opportunities to support the Refurbishment Program. Envelopes are still available in the Church. If you write your name on the donation envelope (please print) your name will be recorded in a book of Supporters of the Refurbishment. The amount given <u>WILL NOT</u> be recorded.

The refurbishment is an exciting development in the life of Holy Family Parish. Obviously, to achieve the extensive improvements that have been outlined over the last few weeks, the Holy Family Church will need to be closed.

- There will be no Baptisms at Holy Family Church for the months of October and November.

I appreciate that this is a short term inconvenience and, in anticipation, I thank you for your patience.
