Reflection... by Michael Tate

Get Clucking!

It all depends on how you read it! This passage can sound very heartless if directed to the destitute, those without the necessities of life - 'Don't worry, be happy.' Yet, we know that Our Lord was filled with compassion for hungry crowds and provided abundant food for them. And we are to pray for our 'daily bread'.

So, where is the emphasis to be sounded? Our Lord is telling us: 'Do not be worried about your life and what food you are to eat, nor about your body and how you are to clothe it. But you are to worry about others, others without adequate food or clothing.' And we know from later in this gospel that that will have eternal consequences: 'I was hungry and you gave me (or didn't give me!) food to eat. I was naked and you gave me (or didn't give me!) clothes to wear.'

The Sermon on the Mount is a constitution for a new society and Our Lord is making provision for one of the responsibilities which will help build up this new way for human beings to relate to one another: the realm of God on earth. Basically, we are to direct our energies, be absorbed in, the needs of others. Set your hearts on this first. The priority is to create this sort of society: the Kingdom of God on earth. Within that social structure you will find that you will be looked after.

It all depends on how you read it! This passage can sound very heartless if directed to the destitute, those without the necessities of life - 'Don't worry, be happy.' Yet, we know that Our Lord was filled with compassion for hungry crowds and provided abundant food for them. And we are to pray for our 'daily bread'.

But you are to worry about others, others without adequate food or clothing.' Basically, we are to direct our energies, be absorbed in, the needs of others. Set your hearts on this first. The priority is to create this sort of society: the Kingdom of God on earth. Within that social structure you will find that you will be looked after.

So, we can read this passage as a justified warning against the brainwashing by the advertising industry creating obsessive concern with what we are to eat, what we are to wear. We have to be free to hear the pleas of the poor here and abroad for decent nourishment, shelter, education and health care. But, do we, do I, *really* believe that I can rest secure knowing that my 'Heavenly Father' (the name Jesus uses), that this Heavenly Father knows what my basic needs are and will prompt others to provide for me?

We need to imitate Our Lord. Get clucking!
