Reflection... by Michael Tate

Being known by Jesus

This is a harder than usual Gospel to preach. Why? Because the first part is a very real warning to those in leadership in the Church and especially to those who, apparently, are doing great things in the name of Jesus Christ. Those who give riveting insights into the Scriptures, those who cast out evil spirits, those who perform miracles, are in danger of hearing these words: 'I have never known you: away from me, you I evil men'!

Why such a fearful prospect? This passage occurs at the end of the Sermon on the Mount. Nowhere in the Sermon does Jesus command his followers to preach, to heal, to perform miracles. Rather he commands a very personal reorientation. As we have heard over the last few weeks, Jesus demands a vulnerability that comes from forsaking violence, from practising fidelity, from being simply truthful, from generosity to the poor. Do those things and one is doing the will of His Father. The rest is good, but surplus.

It is all cymbals clashing and gongs booming. They are all very cacophonous in showing that they know Jesus and can invoke His name. But they don't give Jesus a chance to really know them. "I have never known you". They never give Our Lord the opportunity to penetrate their hearts quietly and persistently. Rather, the next performance is required! They never give Our Lord the time to re-set their internal compass to walk according to the signposts of the Sermon on the Mount.

What should we, what should I, be doing? We, I, should be less doing and more listening. Jesus says 'Everyone who listens to these words of mine [the Sermon on the Mount] and does them will be like a sensible person who built his house on rock.' Will this spare us, me, from the storms of life? No, there will be rain, flood and gale force wind. But the house of our life will still be standing at the end. We all build our lives on some foundation or another: money, prestige, self-indulgence, or even preaching or healing or wonder-working in Christ's name. These are not I the foundation for a life which will see us welcomed into the Kingdom of Heaven. (/Cont'd P4)

Time for examination of conscience! 'These words of mine' refer to nothing but the Sermon on the Mount. Take quiet time to read these words. Take quiet time to understand them. This may be the only opportunity you will have for Jesus to really *know* you when the storms come, especially the final storm of Death. Building your life on any other foundation is to live by someone else's words, and it will all come crashing down: 'And its fall was great.'

There is a beautiful prayer composed for the Lambeth Conference of Bishops in 1948. Let us take it to heart as we attempt to listen to the words of Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount, and to do them.

Almighty God, give us grace to be not only hearers, but doers of thy holy word,not only to admire, but to obey thy doctrine, not only to profess, but to practise thy religion, not only to love, but to live thy gospel. So grant that what we learn of thy glory we may receive into our hearts, and show forth in our lives: through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
