Reflection... by Fr Michael Tate -

Subverting the Social Order - This is a story of subversion, subversion of the social order turned upside down by the healing presence of Jesus.

Jesus is approached by one of the local elite: a male, with a name [Jairus], prestige, an advocate for his twelve year old daughter, and he knows the correct procedure, adopting a deferential posture. Jesus hears his request to heal his daughter and sets off.

Jesus' progress is stopped in its tracks by a contrary figure: a woman, with no name, voiceless, because of her haemorrhaging blood had ostracised her from social and religious contacts, and she adopted the utterly wrong approach. She touched Jesus, or at least his clothing, which risked contaminating him with her 'uncleanness'. But she was immediately healed. This voiceless, marginalised woman was healed at every level of her person: physical, social and religious. She could now mix with people and attend the synagogue. All the woman needed to do was get close and have faith that Jesus would restore her to a life worthy of a human being.

By the way, that is the best way to approach confession – not coming to a judge or magistrate to plead guilty and receive a punishment, but taking Jesus at his word when he spoke of himself as a physician. You or I should come into the confessional conscious of whatever is making one ill-atease with God, with others or with creation because of something one has done or failed to do. Bring that dis-ease into close proximity to Jesus as the Divine Physician. The confessional is 'the hem of his cloak'. He sends you or I out as a healed person in all individual, social and religious dimensions of personality.

But to return to the gospel. Jesus stops and looks around: 'Who touched me?' The disciples are unreconstructed supporters of the social status quo. They regard stopping to find out who touched Jesus as an unfortunate and rather misguided interruption to the important task of continuing on to the house of the local leader, the male at the top of the social scale who had so properly pleaded on behalf of his daughter. But, Jesus does stop and one of the most beautiful moments in the Gospel ensues.

The woman gets her voice back, tells Jesus it was she who had broken all the taboos and touched him. He turns to her and says: 'Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace and be healed of your disease.'

RELAY FOR LIFE 2012 - FR MICK'S MATES: A letter received from Linda Valentino, Community Relations and Fundraising, Cancer Council Victoria, to Trish Stickland, our team captain on June 22, 2012 -

Thankyou for renewing your Research Award in 2012. We're delighted that your generous donation of \$16,716.85 has been allocated to the **Fr Mick's Mates Research Award**. However, the project you funded last year is now complete. This will now support the work of Associate Prof Paul Ekert and Prof Angel Lopez towards research into the treatment and causes of leukaemia.

RESEARCH DESCRIPTION:

Lay Title - Translational and post-translational mechanisms regulating apoptosis in cytokine receptor signalling; Tumour Type - Leukaemia; Field of Research - Biochemistry and Cell Biology; Focus of Research - Research into the treatment and causes of leukaemia

Anticipated Outcome - This project explores the way in which molecules called growth factors keep cells alive. These mechanisms are often functioning abnormally in cancer cells, giving them a survival advantage over normal cells. This work explores this survival advantage in cancer cells and ways to treat it.

PASTORAL CLUSTER COLUMBAN PARTNERSHIP: From July 15 to July 20 a group from the Pastoral Cluster (Principals of the three Primary Schools, three teachers, Trish Stickland and Fr Gerard) will be visiting the Philippines. The purpose of the visit is to regenerate our Partnership with the Columbans and the Kuya Centre. Over the coming weeks I will provide some insight into this Partnership and how together we can make a difference in the service of the poor.

Some detail and rationale of our Columban Partnership which also includes an association with the Religious Order 'Our Lady of the Missions' (an order which Sr Kate O'Neill, formerly of Holy Spirit Church, is a member. Sr Kate is working with the poor in the Philippines)

- The mission of the Church is to implement the teachings of Jesus in the world today. This includes affirmation of the human person, human dignity, the family (the vital cell of society), the promotion of the political and economic institutions to be at the service of the whole community, the stewardship of creation, the promotion of peace and justice.
- The Pastoral Cluster is endeavouring to be true to this Mission through the Columban Partnership Program.
- The Columban Partnership has three aims:
 - 1. To develop lasting relationships with a view to understanding, mutuality, friendship and mission in the global village and respect for diversity of individuals, cultures and beliefs.
 - 2. To engage Australians in a firsthand experience of mission in the developing world.
 - 3. To prompt program participants to engage in further mission activity of whatever kind.
- Furthermore, the Pastoral Cluster has these additional aims:
 - 1. Utilise this Partnership program to enhance the community spirit <u>within</u> the parishes and primary schools and <u>between</u> the parishes and the primary schools
 - 2. To fundraise for a variety of poverty-reducing programs
 - 3. Further develop amongst the people of Geelong, especially the young, an awareness, motivation and an opportunity to serve the poor.

Why the Columban Priests and the Sisters of Our Lady of the Missions?

They have a close integral relationship with the local communities that are the beneficiaries of the Partnership. They have local knowledge and an effective social infrastructure network in place. They have an impressive record of innovation and practice in addressing the causes of poverty.

He, Our Lord Jesus Christ, calls the outcast who had endured social isolation for twelve years, 'Daughter'. This woman heard this term of relationship, this term of affection and care, 'Daughter', from the lips of Jesus. Can you imagine the liberating and joyful effect of hearing that title of honour and love from Our Lord? Yes, Jesus went on to heal the little girl. But unlike the disciples he did not regard stopping as an interruption. It was a priority which totally subverted the expectations and the power structures of that society.

We are not Hindus. A caste system within the church is utterly at odds with this gospel. The Church is distorted if power, prestige, pedigree or wealth give one special status. The saving and healing presence of Jesus must always be allowed to be radically egalitarian. This is good for you and for me when we need the presence of Jesus, the Divine Physician. You and I are a priority when we need that healing presence.

I want you to close your eyes for a moment. Bring to mind whatever it is that is making you ill-at-ease with God. Something you have done or failed to do you that you now experience as a dis-ease in part of your personality. Then say with the woman of today's gospel: 'I will touch the outer garment of my Lord and Saviour. I believe he will forgive me and heal me.' Say it with her profound confidence in divine power.

Keep your eyes closed and hear Him say to you: 'My son [or] my daughter, my son [or] my daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace and be healed of your dis-ease.'
