## **Reflection...** by Richard Leonard SJ

any centuries ago the Pope decided that all the Jews had to leave Rome. Naturally there was an uproar from the Jewish community. So the Pope made a deal. He would have a religious debate with a member of the Jewish community. If the Jews won, they could stay. If the Pope won, the Jews had to leave. The Jews realised that they had no choice. Problem was that no one wanted to debate the Pope. The only volunteer was a poor, simple, old man named Moishe who opened the door to the synagogue each Friday night. Not being used to words Moishe asked for only one addition to the debate - that neither side be allowed to talk. The Pope agreed.

The day of the great debate came. Moishe and the Pope sat opposite each other. The Pope raised his hand and showed three fingers. Moishe looked back at him and

raised one finger. The Pope waved his hand in a circle around his head. Moishe pointed to the ground where he sat. The Pope pulled out a wafer and a glass of wine. Moishe pulled out an apple. The Pope stood up and said, 'I give up. This man is too good. The Jews can stay.'

Later, the Pope explained what happened: 'I held up three fingers to represent the Trinity. He responded by holding up one finger to remind me that we believe in the same one God. Then I waved my hand around my head to show that God was all around us. He responded by pointing to the ground, showing that God was present right here. I pulled out the bread and wine to show that God has given us the Eucharist. He pulled out an apple to remind me of original sin. He had an answer for everything.

What could I do?'

Meanwhile, Moishe explained to the Jewish scholars how he won the unwinnable debate. 'Well', said Moishe, 'First he said that the Jews had three days to get out of Rome. I told him that not one of us was leaving. Then he told me that this whole city would be cleared of Jews. I let him know that we were staying right here.' 'And then what clinched the debate?' asked the Rabbi. 'I don't know', said Moishe. 'It was strange. He took out his lunch, and I took out mine!'

Life always depends on how we read the signs!

In today's Gospel Jesus tells the twelve apostles that they should embody three signs: simplicity of lifestyle, dependence on others and hospitality. /Cont'd P4

**PASTORAL CLUSTER COLUMBAN PARTNERSHIP:** From July 15 to July 20 a group from the Pastoral Cluster (Principals of the three Primary Schools, three teachers, Trish Stickland and Fr Gerard) will be visiting the Philippines. The purpose of the visit is to regenerate our Partnership with the Columbans and the Kuya Centre. Over the coming weeks I will provide some insight into this Partnership and how together we can make a difference in the service of the poor.

### The Itinerary for the Team Visiting the Malate Parish:

Sunday: Arrive in Manila late evening

Monday: Meet with Sr Kate O'Neill to be taken to the Little Sisters of the Assumption to visit the community where the recycled

library bags are made. These bags have been presented to the Prep students at the beginning of the Mass for the last

three years. Later in the afternoon and evening - meet with the Columban Priests.

**Tuesday:** The focus will be on the different elements of the Malate Education Assistance Program. We will visit the nursery schools

in the parish and later in the morning visit the Social and Health Clinic Programs. We then visit the Prep school and the School for Street Children and then meet with various co-ordinators of the Malate Parish to discuss and see the different

elements of each of the programs. Subject to timing a visit to the Night High School.

Wednesday: Visit to CELL (Centre for Ecozoic Living and Learning). This is a Columban project with the focus on sustainable food

production for the rural poor.

Thursday: Visit the Grameen Bank (the Micro Credit Scheme we have been supporting for the last six years) and to see first hand

the projects that have been supported through Micro-Credit. Later in the afternoon visit the Kuya Centre with Sr Kate

O'Neill. This Centre is a home and educational facility for homeless boys.

Friday: In light of the experience the travellers to meet and plan how the Partnership Program can look forward for our parishes

and schools. Return to Australia.

Some detail and rationale of our Columban Partnership which also includes an association with the Religious Order 'Our Lady of the Missions' (an order which Sr Kate O'Neill, formerly of Holy Spirit Church, is a member. Sr Kate is working with the poor in the Philippines)

- The mission of the Church is to implement the teachings of Jesus in the world today. This includes affirmation of the human person, human dignity, the family (the vital cell of society), the promotion of the political and economic institutions to be at the service of the whole community, the stewardship of creation, the promotion of peace and justice.
- ◆ The Pastoral Cluster is endeavouring to be true to this Mission through the Columban Partnership Program.
- ◆ The Columban Partnership has three aims:
  - 1. To develop lasting relationships with a view to understanding, mutuality, friendship and mission in the global village and respect for diversity of individuals, cultures and beliefs.
  - 2. To engage Australians in a firsthand experience of mission in the developing world.
  - 3. To prompt program participants to engage in further mission activity of whatever kind.
- Furthermore, the Pastoral Cluster has these additional aims:
  - 1. Utilise this Partnership program to enhance the community spirit <u>within</u> the parishes and primary schools and <u>between</u> the parishes and the primary schools
  - 2. To fundraise for a variety of poverty-reducing programs
  - 3. Further develop amongst the people of Geelong, especially the young, an awareness, motivation and an opportunity to serve the poor.

These instructions are such a contrast to what most of us value today, where it is often the rich and powerful, the independent and the inhospitable who are thought to be the best leaders.

For Jesus, however, the one truly sent in his name is the one who knows that another's worth comes from who they are, not what they have. It doesn't matter whether we're rich or poor. It's the way we use our money for others which reveals

whether our wealth possesses us or not.

For Jesus, being 'a rock and an island' was not a sign of strength but one of fear and despair. A strong Christian is the one who rejoices in our dependence on each other, and is always grateful for the interconnectedness of life.

For Jesus, making room for others, especially toward those in legitimate need and even when it makes a large claim on us, is a pre-eminent sign of his Kingdom.

The Christian life is about reading the signs of the times. May our Eucharistic signs of his presence amongst us, the bread and wine, change us today, to match it with the best in being simple in lifestyle, happily dependent and extravagantly hospitable with our time, talent and energy for the sake of the Kingdom of God.
