# **Reflection...** by Richard Leonard SJ

Toward the end of 1999 people were gearing up to welcome in the new millennium. Some Christians who take the scriptures literally joined in the fun and declared that the end of the world was nigh and that Christ would return on his two-thousandth birthday.

They seem to subscribe to the old adage that, 'one should never let the facts get in the way of a good story'!

Christianity took over the Roman calendar in what we now call the 4th Century of the Christian era. At Rome in 526, a scholarly monk named Dionysius Exiguus compiled a list of the dates of Jesus' birth, death and resurrection. He assigned dates in the new Christian calendar for each of these events. Given the tools at his disposal, he did an extraordinary job. We know, however, from

other historical sources and from the New Testament, where it mentions who the various Jewish and Roman rulers were in Palestine, that Dionysius was four years out with his dating. The church became aware of this mistake in 1582, but to correct it the world would have lost four years! So we have all lived with it ever since.

We can, however, safely assume that Jesus knows the year in which he was born and that if our fundamentalist Christian friends are right in believing he was going to return on his 2000th birthday, he would have done so in 1996!

The facts are that in every generation we have had people tell us that the sun, moon, stars, wars, famine, tidal waves and earthquakes, mentioned in today's Gospel, all demonstrate that Jesus is about to return. Clearly, we are still waiting. If only the Christians who give out these dire predictions, every so often, would take as

seriously Jesus' words, 'You will know not the time, nor the place when the Son of Man will return in glory'.

Luke's community thought that Jesus would return quickly and spectacularly. They were surprised that the first generation of Christian believers was dying without seeing it all happen. Given the terrible suffering they were enduring for Jesus, the early Christians no doubt hoped that the end of the world would be soon and would demonstrate to everyone that they were not foolish to cling to Christ in the face of all opposition and persecution. The early Christians knew that there was no point professing faith in Jesus Christ unless our daily behaviour reflects his kingdom. It has been a telling point ever since. If every Christian lived out the Gospel in his or her daily life, the world would be transformed and Christ would come in spectacular fashion. /Cont'd P4

#### From the Archbishop's Office for Evangelisation:

We are not the Message, nor the Solution...

Dear Friends.

Now that the Year of Faith has begun we are urged to use this year to deepen our Catholic faith and also to mark the 50th anniversary of Vatican II.

Perhaps one way of doing this is by taking some time to re-read the Council's documents. What emerges for me from re-reading some of the key documents again? I am especially struck by their passionate conviction that the Church is the bearer of a message of universal salvation for humanity.

And what is that message? **That Jesus Christ is what we have to offer the world.** In Jesus Christ is revealed both the fullness of our humanity and the inner heart of a God who is a communion of persons. All of creation is meant to be brought within God's embrace.

Some crucial questions flow from this for our vocation as disciples - whether we be in parishes or other spheres of mission.

- 1. Is this the message that the rising generation of young people is hearing from us?
- 2. Is that the message that our engagement in the public square conveys to all Australians whether Catholic or not?
- 3. Can the Church, while holding fast to the deposit of faith, find a way of expressing her convictions in a way that speaks to the deepest aspirations of this generation for meaning, purpose and community?
- 4. Or will we be seen merely as an increasingly irrelevant group of reactionaries, clinging to a past that is slipping through our grip even as we tighten our fingers?

The future of the Church in Australia may depend on how we answer those questions.

At a time when the Church in Australia is living the ongoing drama of the Paschal Mystery - let us renew and reform ourselves to make faith in Jesus the Crucified and Risen One the centre of our lives. We are not the message nor the solution. Thank God! Jesus is! (*Mark O'Connor fms*)
