beings from the apparent finality of death.

So it is only natural, as it were, that Jesus should liberate this man from the death which has his friends processing with his body through the streets of Nain.

But the man and his friends are not the main focus of Jesus. It may be daring to say that Jesus did not bring the man back to life out of concern for the man.

When the Lord saw her, he felt compassion towards *her* - not *him*! Who is this 'her' whom Jesus really focused on, particularly saw in that little procession of mourners?

She was a widow in a patriarchal society. The dead son is not a youngster but a man. He is the breadwinner and protector for his mother. Without an able man in her household, she will be reduced to poverty and be very vulnerable.

And so the Gospel tells us that Jesus 'felt compassion towards her'. The Greek actually says that his guts were in turmoil with pity. So, he does what any gutsy person would do in the situation: his uttermost to help her.

We may say that Jesus restored the life of this man in order to restore the life of the mother. The Gospel emphasises this by telling us the purpose of this saving ministry of Jesus: 'He gave him to his mother.' She would now have enough to eat, and be able to live out her years in a secure household.

It is obvious that Jesus had the most alert eyes, always on the lookout for the person whom society would relegate to a miserable existence without some saving intervention.

How is our society organised? Can you see those who are vulnerable? Does the mere seeing send a shudder of compassion through your body, as it did for Jesus?

The **Inquiry Period** will begin on Wed 7th August at 7.30pm at the Pastoral Cluster Centre, 147 Separation St Bell Park. NEWS FROM KUYA -

"It is my great pleasure to communicate with you today giving you some news about us. You have always showed a constant interest. I hope these few lines will help in strengthening our relationship. Since May 2012, Kuya Center has welcomed 36 street children between 7 and 17 years old into our Center. Some of them have been reconciled with their family and some have been referred to long-term institutions to help them continue their studies.

At this time, 14 boys are living at the center. In the streets our staff meets regularly around 150 children, 97 boys and 52 girls, reaching out to them and providing instruction, education, care and, when possible some food and some medicines. We continue to cater for more than 20 children that are part of our community-based program. Some of those children are former kids that Kuya Center rescued in the past and are finishing their high school studies. Our partnership with Immigration Solutions Australia (ISA Group) has enabled two boys to continue in vocational training, while our partnership with the RNDM Sisters provides livelihood opportunities for many of the mothers of our former street children."
