Coday's Gospel announces that 'God is with us'. In this final week of Advent the following story reminds us that God comes to us in unpredictable ways often with unsettling messages.

SURVEY ON SEXUALITY, MARRIAGE AND THE FAMILY: I forwarded the findings of our survey to the Archbishop, Mons Greg Bennet the Vicar General and Matthew MacDonald, Executive Officer of the Life, Marriage and Family Office. Each responded favourably and with thanks for the survey. The generic response from Matthew MacDonald was as follows:

"Archbishop Hart would like to thank all who contributed to the recent survey in preparation for the Extraordinary Synod on the Family. We received over 1,100 contributions. Each Australian diocese has submitted a synthesis to the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference. From those, a submission will be made to Rome before the end of January. At some stage after the Extraordinary Synod, which begins on 5th October 2014, Pope Francis will respond with some form of letter or Apostolic Exhortation."

'In a few minutes his aunty came back and I wheeled my cart away. I could not keep from thinking about the little boy as I finished my shopping in a totally different spirit than when I had started.

'On the way home I remembered a story in the newspaper several days earlier about a drunk driver hitting a car and killing a little girl and that the mother was left on life support. Two days before Christmas I read in the paper where the family had turned the machine off. The day before Christmas there was a funeral notice saying that a Requiem Mass would be celebrated on St Stephen's Day for Julia Norris and her daughter Emily. Michael was their husband and father, and their son and brother was David.

'As I gathered with my family in front of an overblown meal which none of us could finish, holding expensive gifts we didn't need and drinking more alcohol than was necessary, I thought "we've lost the plot with Christmas". God-with-us arrives as a simple child in need of love; and in the honour of that day we spend money, eat too much and get drunk.

'I left the table went to my desk and wrote a card for each member of my family. I told them what I'd never been able to say: "I want you to know I love you."

"When they read those cards, my family thought I was losing it, but through David and that doll, God visited me in the last week of Advent and Christmas will never be the same again."
