# Reflection by Richard Leonard SJ

For many people 'going home', means a return to comfort and security.

In the best homes children are unafraid, they know that their home is a buffer against some harsh realities beyond the door. As adults we carry that desire for security into all the various homes in which we live.

When we reflect on our childhood homes many of us can say of it what Jesus says of himself. It was the first place almost all of us learnt about 'The Way'. The earliest Christians were called people of The Way. It's a rich image denoting that Christianity is not an idea, it's a way of living, a path to follow.

For better or worse one of the distinctive features of most of our homes is that it's also where we are told 'The Truth'. Sometimes that deflates our egos or means we hear things we would rather not listen to. But hopefully the comfort and love which accompanies this truth telling comes from the ease and care in the relationships at home. Our family doesn't pull any punches with the truth

because they know us too well and love us too much.

Most adults also remember their childhood houses as lively. 'The Life' in our homes was about the buzz of children going to and from school, various friends calling in, the reign of organised chaos where space was claimed and a position defended. Minor dramas were never far away and life was lived to the full.

It's not by accident that the image of Jesus preparing us a house and being the Way, the Truth and the Life are put together in today's Gospel. In another part of John's gospel Jesus goes further in describing himself as our master builder, as our home and even our lodger. We are told to make a home in him as he makes a home in us. What a terrific image of the intimacy Christ wants to share with us, and we with him!

The best homes, however, do not just protect and keep their occupants safe for eternity. A home is a means to an end, which is to give us

the stability and sanity we need to keep going out to the world beyond it. In the same way, our home of faith with Jesus enables us to keep going out to a sometimes hostile world and share with others the Way, the Truth and the Life that sustains us. In a world where 70% of all people have substandard housing and millions of displaced people have to create homes wherever they are, we have our work cut out for us.

The Way we follow is about justice, development and peace for all people everywhere and not just the select few who can build the biggest mansions on earth. We are invited to keep speaking the Truth even if that makes us unpopular or different or at odds with the majority. And we have to keep living the Life which sees that our greatest joy comes from human dignity being celebrated everywhere.

If all Christians lived out this Way, Truth and Life we would, by His grace, fulfil Jesus' extraordinary prophecy that we could do greater works than He did. Now that's a challenge to take with us into the coming week!

#### **PASTORAL CLUSTER SURVEY NO.2**

The responses to Question 1 and 3 of this survey are outlined below. I have listed all the responses and have endeavoured to categorise them in a form that is accessible and, hopefully, helpful. My intention is to do justice to your considerations. The 2nd question *Initiatives I would like to see introduced* have been collated and will be an important document for future consideration and action.

The first written response was to the statement - In my view the three most important things for my Parish/Cluster are/ought to be:

#### The Mass (124)

## Community experience of friendship, sense of belonging, welcome, acceptance of diversity of people (110)

The provision of Mass, including parishioners involvement in the celebration of Mass, linking homilies to faith and life, Mass at convenient times, special Masses for the ill and frail, good worship music, choirs etc

#### Helping those in need (88)

Pastoral outreach to the poor, refugees, the bereaved, domestic abuse, marital needs, helping the elderly attend Mass, general community outreach, Fr Mick's Mates, the international outreach, pastoral care to parishioners in times of special need, eg bereavement, support for families and the aged, the welcoming of new parishioners, outreach to those who have drifted away

## A place/community of prayer, reflection, spiritual formation, devotional prayer (65)

#### A youth support (58)

To foster youth support to be better engaged in the Mass and the parish in general, the provision of youth functions and groups

#### Social Involvement and Engagement in the Wider Community (51)

The importance of volunteers, of working together, the provision of social activities and gatherings such as BBQ's, parish balls, dinner dances, cuppas after Mass

#### The Sacraments (50)

The provision of all the Sacraments and for them to be well celebrated

# Good Stewardship and Leadership (43)

Includes the maintenance of Church buildings, transparent decision-making processes, effective communication, value centred leadership based on compassion, faith, love; less clerical structures, promotion of pursuing of time, talent and treasure, the importance of parish offering and thanksgiving

## The service of Priests (42)

The importance of the Priests' presence, availability, accessibility and interaction of the Priests in parish, pastoral needs and community activities

## Formation of Laity in Ministry and Faith Education (38)

This area covered a broad gamut of issues on Church life, Catholic school education, the importance of reverence in God's House, devotional prayer and doctrinal matters

## Support for younger families (28)

Fostering the faith, Children's Liturgy, provision of good religious education, teaching respect and reverence at Mass, increased involvement of children in the Mass

#### A strong connection between school and parish (27)

#### God's Word (13)

The importance of preaching the Gospel for formation in a way that is relevant to today's circumstances

The third written response was to the statement - If there was only one Priest in the Pastoral Cluster, how can we best provide for the spiritual and pastoral needs of the people?

#### The Involvement and more participation of the Laity in the life of the Church (146)

Includes the role of special ministers in leadership of prayer, including baptisms and funerals; appointment of Pastoral Associates; lay people to take on more of the non-Sacramental roles; community to take on the greater responsibility of caring for each other; better utilise lay people's gifts and talents; greater involvement of women, church elders; importance of proper and effective formation of lay people; ensure properly qualified lay people are given responsibilities in the parish
