## eflection by Michael Tate

According to St Paul 'the whole of creation ...is yearning to share in the glory promised to the children of God.' (Romans 8)

In the meantime it is as though from the beginning every element of the universe is 'listening out' for the word which will bring it into harmony with that deepest yearning, listening so as to exist in a way which is never destructive of God's plan for humanity and all other creatures.

And that is what happens in this gospel episode. What is the situation of creation? One has a howling wind, shrieking against every timber of the boat, storm-tossed

waves threatening to engulf and sink the boat. What word is heard by these elements of the universe? A word which they hear even as they are at their most destructive. 'Quiet, be still.' [repeat]

And there was a dead calm. Why? Because this was a word spoken by the Lord of all creation, the Sovereign of the universe. And what was the result? The disciples were able to make their way across the Sea of Galilee 'to the other side' in the company of Jesus. What does that mean?

They were able to go from the western Jewish side to the eastern Pagan side.

That is from the side which they knew, from the side with which they were familiar, from the side where they were 'at home' to the side which they did not know, which was unfamiliar territory for them, where, far from being at home, they would feel dislocated, dis-placed.

That is why this gospel story is good news for us, for you and for me. There will be times, there have been times when, in the journey of life, suddenly chaos erupts. A tempest storms into our life. The wind is howling. We want to block our ears to the situation threatening us whether from the outside or from some part of our own personality. /Cont'd P4

#### FR GERARD'S SABBATICAL:

As part of the Archdiocese commitment to the ongoing formation and education of priests, there is a sabbatical program. The purpose of the program is that it is an extended time of prayer, study and reflection. I have been fortunate enough to have been granted a sabbatical. The sabbatical will begin on **Monday June 22nd** and I return for the weekend of **October 24/25th**.

The major focus of my time away will be to deepen my own understanding and practice of Christian Meditation as well as gaining some experience in the introduction of Christian Meditation in a variety of contexts such as schools, prisons, etc. To that end the sabbatical will entail a Seminar on Meditation in the Monastic Tradition (Rome), a pilgrimage in the footsteps of St Columbine (the spiritual inspiration for the Columban Priests), some time at the World Christian Meditation Headquarters in London, an 8-day Silent Retreat at Bere Island, eight days on the Camino Pilgrimage Walk in Portugal/Spain and working in Townsville with the Catholic Education Office where they have introduced Christian Meditation in all their Catholic Schools.

I am grateful to the Archbishop for giving me this opportunity and for the ongoing Formation of Priests Committee for paying for the Sabbatical. I am also grateful for the Priests who will be supplying for me in my absence. I am sure you will make them feel very welcome. I am particularly appreciative and grateful to Fr Mick and the Pastoral Cluster staff for 'holding the fort' in my absence. (Fr Gerard)
