Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

It is fitting that on New Year's Day we celebrate *the* calendar-shattering event in human history: the extraordinary role that a young woman in Galilee played in God's plan for the human race.

In the Western Church, the young woman is titled 'Mother of God'. This signifies a relationship, a loving, nurturing relationship. We know that it

encompassed a mother's horror of seeing her son tortured and done to death on the Cross.

Yes, she was a mother, but Mother of *God*.

How can this be portrayed for our minds to grasp? In the Book of Genesis, the creative act which began all reckoning of the passage of time and seasons was signalled by the Divine Wind hovering over the formless void. When that Holy Gust hovered over Mary, and she responded: 'Be it done unto me according to thy Word', the human existence of Our Lord Jesus Christ began, the fulcrum of history from which our calendar begins.

We could pause for a moment to pray that at the end of all history, at the end of all calendars, we may share in Divine life with Mary of Galilee, Mother of God.

AMALGAMATION OF THE THREE PARISHES OF THE PASTORAL CLUSTER INTO ONE PARISH WITH THREE CHURCHES:

You may recall on the weekend of October 29/30 2016, I spoke about the amalgamation of the three parishes of the Pastoral Cluster into one parish. With the support of the Finance and Parish Leadership Team, the Amalgamation was proposed to change the Canonical (Church Law) status to more accurately reflect the long shared history of the three parishes of the Pastoral Cluster.

The proposal for Amalgamation was forwarded to the Archbishop and his consultors for their consideration. The Archbishop has accepted the request for Amalgamation. The Archbishop's extensive note on this matter is on the noticeboard at the back of each Church.

As part of the process the Archbishop required that there had to be a designated locality of the new parish and a new Patron. Each of the three Churches and Schools retain their names but the new parish would be named after this Patron.

Our new Patron is St Michael the Archangel and our locality is Bell Park. Hence the Amalgamated Parish is known as St Michael's, Bell Park.

The Archbishop has asked that I speak about the Amalgamation on the weekend of 21/22 January 2017. If there are any questions or concerns please let Ime know so that they are incorporated into the presentation. (Fr Gerard)
