oday is traditionally called Gaudete Sunday. Over the first millennium of Christianity Advent was like a late Lent. Both were five weeks long, both were marked by fasting and penance and both gave the faithful a day off half way through. In Lent Laudete Sunday is still, roughly, half way through the five-week season. Advent, however, was shortened to four weeks in the tenth century, and Pope St Gregory the Great eased the fasting and penitential aspects of this season in the twelfth century, but the not-so-half-way Gaudete Sunday has remained. It is, literally, the 'rejoicing' Sunday when we look more directly at Jesus' coming at Christmas.

To enable us to look at Jesus we start with the man who heralded his mission in the world, John the Baptist. In today's Gospel John the Baptist is the model of humility, opening the way for the Kingdom of Jesus to break in upon the world. We should never underestimate talent spotters, for as this story demonstrates, they all have John the Baptist as their patron saint.

Fleming was a poor Scottish farmer in the nineteenth century. One day, while trying to make a living for his family, he heard a cry for help coming from a nearby bog. He dropped his tools and ran to the bog. There, mired to his waist in black muck, was a terrified boy, screaming and struggling to free himself. Farmer Fleming saved the lad from what could have been a slow and terrifying death.

The next day, a fancy carriage pulled up to the Scotsman's sparse cottage. An elegantly dressed nobleman stepped out and introduced himself as the father of the boy Farmer Fleming had saved. 'I want to repay you,' said the nobleman. 'You saved my son's life.' 'No, I can't accept payment for what I did,' the Scottish farmer replied, waving away the offer.



## St Michael's News:

### CHANGE TO WEEKEND MASS TIMETABLE

2018 will be a new beginning for the Parish of St Michael's.

Over the years one of the objectives has been to implement processes and rationalisation of services so that the parish could be led and administered by one Parish Priest alone. This objective has largely been achieved with one notable exception - the number of weekend Masses.

My hope was that an Assistant Priest or a retired Priest would be appointed to St Michael's, so that we could continue to provide the weekend Mass timetable to which you have become accustomed. The realisation of this hope is unlikely.

Since Fr Rolyn has been appointed elsewhere, I have maintained the five Masses but this is not realistic, sustainable and, in fact, is contrary to Canon Law which only allows a Priest to say five Masses on a weekend with the Archbishop's permission and in exceptional circumstances.

St Michael's, being a one Priest parish, is no longer exceptional but will become the new normal, hence there is a need to rationalise the weekend Masses.

After consultation with the Parish Leadership Team, the Weekend Mass Timetable will be as follows:

#### Saturday Evening 5pm Ss Peter & Paul's, Geelong West Sunday morning 8am Holy Family, Bell Park 9.30am Holy Family, Bell Park 11am Holy Spirit, Manifold Hts

This new timetable will take effect from the weekend of **30th/31st December**, **2017**. Many thanks in anticipation of your understanding - Fr Gerard

"Rejoice always, pray constantly, give thanks in all circumstances;

for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (1Thess 5:16-18

This scripture reading sums up Stewardship. "Rejoice always" means place your trust in God; he will provide all that you need. "Pray constantly" means prayer should be a running conversation with God throughout the whole day, every day. "Give thanks in all circumstances" means even in bad situations, thank God. Suffering a little bit helps build empathy for others in similar situations.

The scriptures tell us from the beginning of time to the preaching of John the Baptist, to the life, death, resurrection of Jesus Christ and to the continuing work of the Holy Spirit among us today, that we have a God who risked

everything so that we might know love and life in this world and in the next. We hold and proclaim, in season and out of season, a God who emptied himself of power and might and came to us as a baby.

That's not the profile of a deal-doer.

It's the portrait of a lover.

So this Advent let's not ransom ourselves to a benevolent dictator. Let's ask for anything we need with confidence that God has heard our words and so sent love itself in Jesus Christ our Lord.
