Reflection by Richard Leonard SJ

read a terrific book the other day entitled 'Shadows and the Dark'. It is by Australian Jesuit Fr John Cowburn who is Professor of Philosophy at Jesuit Theological College, Melbourne. This book explores how we can hold to a loving God in the face of evil.

The idea for the book came when Fr John fell from his bicycle, broke his collarbone and was awaiting surgery in hospital.

While there, an old religious sister came to his room to give him Holy Communion before going to the operating theatre. Fr John told her about the accident. Sister said, 'Well Father, God must have known you needed a little holiday, so he arranged for

your fall'. John replied, 'If that's true Sister I'm pleased God didn't want me to take a

sabbatical!' From Jesus' day to ours, when bad things happen to good people it seems easier to blame God or Satan.

By his own admission Fr John had an accident because he didn't take enough care on his bike. End of story. That God can bring something good out of such an accident is grace building on nature. What Jesus confronts in today's Gospel is 'The-devilmade-me-do-it' theology. And his response is as challenging now as it was in first century Palestine.

For as long as we blame our most destructive behaviour on evil acting upon us in all its guises, empty promises and powers, then we remain some way from taking the sort of responsibility for the condition of our hearts that might see them fully converted by Christ's saving love.

This is not to say that evil does not exist or

that it cannot have a powerful effect upon us, quite the opposite. Just as grace builds on love and goodness, evil grows out of estrangement and hatred.

As Christians we hold that God has given us free will, and evil's hold on our hearts is often the result of the poor choices and smaller compromises we have made along the way.

The way we look at the evil in our lives and the world also affects our compassion. For if we're not in touch with the greed that leads to theft, the anger that leads to murder, the desire for power that leads to rape, or the alienation that leads to terrorism, then it's hard for us to be compassionate toward the perpetrators of these evil acts.

More about happiness

ho are the happiest people in the world? With the benefits we enjoy it should be us in Australia. But not so. We may think we are pretty well off in this country. But that's not the same as feeling *joyful*. There are a number of indicators of having the experience of living in a joyful moment. Have you experienced the following in the last two days? Have you smiled, laughed or chuckled? Have you felt that you are treated with respect? Have you experienced real enjoyment (of food, company, music etc.)? Have you learned something new and interesting? Do you feel well-rested?

These are the kinds of questions a United Nations agency measuring happiness across the World asks people. These questions are not addressing the issue of how contented you are with your lot in life. They're trying to find out how often you get a real buzz or kick out of life

Latin Americans top the chart for the frequency with which they get a real kick out of life. To be precise the poorest countries in South America are where the most people experience the most positive day to day feelings. You have to get to No. 9 on the list before you hit a non-Latin American country. That's Canada, followed by the Philippines (another poor country).

But the survey also found Latin Americans aren't happy all the time. They also reported above average levels of negative feelings: including experiencing worry, sadness, anger, stress and depression. Crime, corruption and inequality which are rife in those countries take their toll. It's just that the locals seem to have found ways to also experience high levels of daily happiness, despite their economic circumstances. Where do they find that daily joy to cope with the sh** that life throws at them? South Americans are more likely to visit friends and family than Australians.

So is this the secret ingredient to explain their capacity to grab joy where and when they can?

Latin America has 650 million diverse peoples but with a fairly common set of cultural values. This leads to a society that has a slower pace of life and that is not so focused on generating economic growth as it is in living and enjoying life within existing conditions. It is permeated with extended-family values and the community values of indigenous groups, where relatives tend to live together and to be in close contact.

When asked about the frequency of their contact with family members, more than two fifths of Brazilians said they had visited at least one uncle or aunt more than twice in the last four weeks. In Australia, the figure was less than 5 per cent. More than a quarter of Brazilians said they had visited at least one cousin in that same time period, compared to less than 5 per cent of Australians. Half of Brazilians had visited at least one niece or nephew, compared to 10 per cent of Australians. And it's not just family. Latin Americans are more likely to be in close contact with friends too. Two thirds of Brazilians said they visited their closest friend on either a daily basis or at least several times a week. Just a fifth of Australians said the same.

In living their lives do they draw their inspiration from Jesus' words? Or did Jesus draw his wisdom from living for 33 years among people such as these?

"I am telling you not to worry about your <u>life</u> and what you are to eat, nor about your body and what you are to wear. Surely <u>life</u> is more than food, and the body more than clothing! So do not worry about tomorrow: tomorrow <u>will</u> take care of itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own." <u>Matthew 6:31-34</u>

"Two are better than one, because they have a better return for their labour: If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up. Also, if two lie down together, they will keep warm. But how can one keep warm alone? Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken." Ecclesiastes 4:9-12.

"And let us consider how to inspire one another to love and good deeds. Do not neglect to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encourage one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching." <u>Hebrews 10:24-25</u>
