SPIRITUAL CARE SERVICES AT BARWON HEALTH AND COVID -19.

During the Covid-19 period Spiritual Care staff at Barwon Health continue to provide faith-based and non-faith-based care for patients, families and staff by distance support, and face to face in certain situations.

There is a 24 hour pastoral care service with a staff member on call. There is the services of a Catholic chaplain provided by St. Mary of the Angel's Parish at the hospital who is able to facilitate the visit of a priest when requested and available.

Spiritual care staff are able to provide support to patients, families, and staff by distance support and face to face in certain circumstances.

Spiritual Care staff are able to respond to visits face to face where the referrals are urgent or high distress.

Spiritual Care are able to facilitate the visit of a priest in cases of "end of life" and emergencies.

If you are a patient and would like a visit from the chaplain, please chat to your nurse carer who will refer you to the Spiritual Care unit.

If you know of someone who is going to hospital and would appreciate a visit from the chaplain, with their permission, you are able to contact the hospital and ask for the Spiritual Care unit.
